

Points to Ponder: Life & Human Dignity

Consider asking your riding's candidates the following questions, and discussing their answers with your family, friends, neighbours, coworkers, and fellow parishioners:

- None of the parties has addressed any life issues, or shared any information confirming its view of the meaning of life. What are Catholics to make of that? What can we do about it to gather and illuminate souls?
- What limits should be placed on voluntary termination of human life, either prior to birth or at any time before death? What alternatives to abortion or to socially-assisted death (SAD) should be offered in NL?
- Is current national and provincial investment in palliative care (care which neither hastens nor postpones natural death, but is intended to relieve suffering, particularly when human accompaniment is available) for terminally ill individuals adequate? Are sufficient spaces for such care available to meet the needs of the province? Are we, as individuals and a Church, doing as much as we can to accompany the terminally ill on their journey back to God?
- Human engineering, for example in the forms of population control, cloning and cell manipulation, selective birth, and "gender assignment" procedures, is also of concern. What can or should we do, as a nation, a Church, and as individuals?

Points to Ponder: Stewardship of Creation

Many voices, including scientists, the Vatican, and the United Nations, agree that climate change is real and that immediate action is required if catastrophic consequences are to be avoided. Other voices insist that while the climate may be changing, any change is naturally cyclic and humans are having no effect.

Liberal Party

Role of and Support for the Family -party states that it implemented \$25 per day child care, bringing more parents into the workplace and ensuring that more children receive early learning and care. -commits \$110 million toward \$10-day child care.

Health Care & Elder Care

-seeks reduction of NL mortality rates due to cancer, heart disease, stroke and lung diseases, and diabetes (highest in Canada) by offering healthy, physically active lifestyles tax credit for costs of fitness classes and sports programs. -advocates more facilities and transport options for people traveling for specialized services, and adding more primary health care teams.

-notes that record high investments have increased the health care budget by more than 40 per cent since 2020. -says it reduced wait times for surgeries and priority care 12 per cent or more since 2023; has invested \$620 million in a health information system.

- -allocated \$200 million in 2025 for prescription drugs, and \$8.5 million to expand helicopter medevac.
- -added mental health and addictions services and centre. -is working to alleviate period poverty.

Flder Care

-advocates a provincial Seniors' Advocate to speak for seniors, and a new guide to address the gap between young people and older adults.

-reports that Seniors' Benefit will be indexed starting in 2025; commits \$200,000 to promote inclusion of seniors.

Education & Young Workers

-budget speech advocates adding 400+ educators and expanding school food programming for Pre-K thru 9. -promotes restorative justice in education as a way of teaching empathy to children and society. -commits more than \$70 million for school infrastructure. -to keep youth in the province, requiring contractors to prioritize apprentice hiring for gov't jobs; subsidies and financial assistance for vocational education. -updating the health curriculum on exercise, nutrition, mental health, addictions and sexual health. -allocated \$482 million for universities: doubling the number of subsidized seats for NL residents at the Atlantic Veterinary College.

Culture, Arts & Tourism

-proposes an incubator and accelerator to enhance and grow promising organizations in the community sector. -increased funding for provincial libraries 2 years in a row. -new corporate tax credit for 40 per cent of film production costs, maximum of \$20 million per year. -\$8.5 million in grants for residents to engage in sports programs, increased funding for the provincial Games. \$6 million+ for culture and arts infrastructure. expanding the Trail of the Caribou Program.

New Democratic Party

Role of and Support for the Family

-party is committed to introduction of a universal, accessible food school program, in order to provide all students in the province with nutritious food for breakfast, lunch, and recess breaks at no cost to students or families.

Health Care & Elder Care

-advocates creation of a publicly-funded and administered Universal Home Care program, based on the model used by the province of Manitoba. -seeks enactment of Disabilities Act including centralized,

comprehensive and updated protections for those living with disabilities within the province, developed in consultation with public and private stakeholders. -advocates unrestricted access to ostomy products. -it supports adoption of uniform provincial standards for staffing, diet, medication, number of residents per room, and financing for aged care facilities as part of Medicare. -endorses universal pharmacare and dental care, as proposed by the Federal NDP.

Culture, Arts & Tourism

-advocates allowing surrogate hunters, with no distance limit, to hunt game on behalf of hunters with mobility issues and other disabilities, and seeks filling of vacant wildlife officer positions in Labrador.

-seeks recognition of a trapper's base camp and its associated tilts as one enterprise and subsequently billed as a single Permit to Occupy, including review of outstanding trapper issues in collaboration with the Newfoundland and Labrador Trappers Association. -advocates banning use of urine or hair follicle tests in provincial workplaces, as they discriminate against medicinal and recreational users of cannabis; and exploring use of saliva testing, sobriety field testing, or future technologies to better determine workplace

-advocates bars/lounges for the safe consumption of cannabis for adults of legal age.

Progressive Conservative Party

Role of the Family

-the party has published no current statement concerning the role of or policies to support the family.

Health Care & Elder Care

The party's most recent platform publication (dated 2019) states that it is unacceptable that, with all the money spent on health care, some people still don't have a family doctor or languish on waitlists or in hospital hallways, and that seniors languish in crowded care wards because there is nowhere to go.

- -advocates innovative reform within current funding, for quality person-centred health care.
- -to keep young people in the province, the party advocates improving health care by appointing a Chief Wellness Officer, providing first aid training in high school, covering 100% of medical transportation costs, providing innovative clinics and virtual care to improve patient access. recruiting physicians and health providers by addressing fee structures and scope of practice, removing restrictions on Personal Care Homes, supporting community residential hospice/end of life care and development of a Cardiac Centre of Excellence, providing coverage for insulin pumps with no age cap, improved electronic records, increased efficiency, implementing a Quality Health Council and base staff level review of nursing homes to improve long-term care, preventing cuts in mental health and addictions, and ensuring improved access for all, treating gambling addiction by addressing the addictive features of certain VLTs, and developing an autism strategy, including removal of the IQ70 criterion. - appointment of a Seniors' Advocate to employ new investigative and reporting powers.

Education & Young Workers

- advocates focusing education on the foundational skills that are key to successful learning and preparing students for life-long learning in an innovative society, in order to reduce achievement gaps between rich and poor, the learning advantaged and disadvantaged, urban and rural, and overall performance students compared the rest of Canada, developing performance targets that help meet

-proposes implementing a Graduate Retention Program, including a tax credit for grads who choose to work in NL, and making post-secondary tuition and student aid the most competitive in the country.

Culture, Arts & Tourism

-seeks to restore confidence in the future and keep young people in the province by developing a tourism strategy to bring people to rural communities, including an Air Access Strategy to promote more flights at lower cost, along with growth and more jobs.

-supporting ArtsNL sustain jobs for artists, promote tourism, educate and inspire, and implementing a New Northern Strategic Plan for Labrador.

Industries, Corporations, Consumers

The development of economic activity and growth in production are meant to provide for the needs of human beings. Economic life is not meant solely to multiply goods produced and increase profit or power; it is ordered first of all to the service of persons, of the whole man, and of the entire human community. -2426, Catechism of the Catholic Church

Liberal Party

Economy for All -due to oil and mineral production, expects NL to lead all

provincies in real GDP for 2025. -expects employment to rise by 1.2% to 10.8% in 2025, primarily due to the effects of US tariffs. Consumer inflation to increase to 2.5%

Housing and Poverty Reduction

-2025 budget introduces a Disability Benefit of up to \$400 per month; basic income for youth in provincial residential services; and a basic income pilot for people aged 60 to 64 receiving Income Support.

- invests \$113 million in 2025 for affordable public housing, including 180 units to be occupied in late 2025; and \$11.7 million to partner with non-profit shelters. -Five Point Housing Plan helps low-to-moderate income families afford down-payments on first homes. -has simplified the process of claiming adverse possession ("squatters rights").

Labour, Unions & Employment

-to reduce out-migration and promote jobs, proposes reliance on local, inclusive labour for provincial infrastructure projects, and hiring and mentoring apprentices. Continues to promote education and skills training for NL residents to enter the tech industry. -prioritizes local buying for provincial procurement...

Corporations, Competition & Consumers

-creating InvestNL online trade desk to support investment in NL; allocates \$35 million to support business and economic development. -allocates \$1 million in wholesale discounts for restaurants and bars purchasing beer, wine, cider. -commits \$11 million for subsidized crop insurance and making farms and communities more resilient; \$618,000 for programs to increase provincial food self-sufficiency. -supports inclusive growth of the aquaculture industry, including secondary processing of by-products. -to promote long-term success in the wild-caught fish industry, promotes improved seafood quality; helps fish harvesters enter new markets; launched Loan and Marketing Support Programs. -\$4.5 million for infrastructure and innovation to support

the Atlantic Fisheries Fund and develop new markets. -2025 budget cites major contribution of oil and gas to to the NL economy, allocates \$90 million beginning in 2026 for increased exploration.

-allocates \$6 million to support mining activity focused on developing critical mineral resources.

-invests \$4.2 million to lead wildfire responses, including establishment of Atlantic Wildfire Centre.

-allocates \$4 million for to prevent Spruce Budworm outbreaks, supports 5-7 million tree seedlings annually. -invested \$23 million to leverage \$165 million from other investors for tech.

-allocates \$1.1 billion in 2025 for infrastructure, to generate \$690 million in economic activity and create new jobs with new roads, airstrips, and ferries.

Economy for All

Advocates a provincial Green New Deal aimed at social. economic, and environmental betterment, including consultation with stakeholders to explore the most effective approach to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, provide a just transition for workers in affected industries, strengthen environmental protections, and update the provinces labour laws to build a more just and equitable society protecting the environment. -advocates creation of a public telecom crown corporation to provide low-cost internet and television and bring high-quality, reliable coverage to the whole of

New Democratic Party

-advocates a public auto insurance program to lower rates and protect consumers.

-supports a \$15 and fairness wage campaign. -advocates rent regulation to (i) protect renters'

legitimate interest in retaining homes, (ii) advance the social interest in stable, mixed-income neighbourhoods: and (ii) curb the power of landlords, while (iii) protecting tenants from eviction or other pressure through an automatic right to renew their lease unless the landlord can demonstrate nonpayment of rent or other good

Labour, Unions & Employment

Advocates immediate action to protect pensions of NL residents, including first priority in bankruptcy claims, requirements that trust accounts hold pension funds for companies operating within NL but domiciled elsewhere: denying companies the right to withdraw funds from pension plans; and denying companies the opportunity to withhold payments to pension plans as required by

-advocates adoption of a 90% income replacement rate for Worker's Comp, and ending compensation ceilings. -seeks a living wage, with annual adjustments. -supports right of all workers, full-time, part-time, or gig, unionize, including amendment of the NL Labour Relations Act (LRA) to support enforcement of good faith bargaining requirements; reinstatement of automatic certification of unions once 65% of workers have signed; and introduction of anti-scab legislation.

-advocates ban on urine or hair follicle tests in provincial workplaces, as they discriminate against medicinal and recreational users of cannabis; and exploring use of saliva testings, sobriety field testing, or future technologies to monitor workplace intoxication.

Corporations, Competition or Consumers

To support the aquaculture industry, the party advocates ending funding and expansion plans for net pen use in the province and calls for a responsible plan to transition to a land-based, zero-effluent, RAS-based provincial finfish aquaculture industry within 5 years.

Economy for All

The party states that job creation is the best economic policy for government and families, the best social policy in its own right and also to sustain public expenditure on health, education, and all other public services, and the only way to grow the population.

Progressive Conservative Party

-attention to fairness and equity in employment is the best way to reduce economic and social disparities and build the more just society we all want.

-government cannot deliver jobs from the public purse, as the public purse has been drained.

The party's latest platform document (dated 2019) advocates:

-collaborating with businesses to put people to work. -tailoring Community Benefits Agreements to create opportunities for apprentices and local suppliers. -growing the provincial population; making postsecondary tuition and student aid the most competitive in the country.

Public Safety

The Proper Role of Government

The purpose of government is to support the authentic development of all souls that it governs: to facilitate their search for the truth, which is God. This includes providing an appropriate legal and economic framework, including respect for the dignity the human rights of all.

-in the absence of general consensus on values, the deepest meaning of democracy is lost and its stability is compromised.
-elected representatives are obliged to give account of their work on behalf of the public.

-if there is no ultimate truth to guide and direct political action, then the manipulation of ideas and convictions can easily turn democracy into totalitarianism.

Intergovernmental Relations

Relations between various jurisdictions and levels of government should be governed by the principles of truth and subsidiarity: they should be transparent end structured to allow local governments to do their jobs responsibly, without undue interference.

Global care for the environment

It is important that the international community draw up uniform rules that will allow States to exercise more effective control over abuse of the environment and the protection of ecosystems. Such rules must promote growing sense of responsibility as well as an effective change of mentality and lifestyle.

Displaced Persons & Humanitarian Aid

It is essential to seek out the causes underlying wars so that the causes of forced migration can be addressed.

Finance

- -for <u>community organizations</u> that contribute to the social and economic well-being of communities, more than \$100 million in grants.

Courts & Public Safety

The 2025 Budget:

-allocates \$55 million for facilities, including a <u>replacement</u> <u>penitentiary and new corrections facilities</u>.

Points to Ponder

Family, Community & the Common Good

- In what circumstances, if any, is it appropriate for governments to place limits on the right of parents to make decisions pertaining to the care or education of their children?
- Some political parties have suggested that in order to maximize gross economic return, full participation by all eligible workforce members, including all parents whether members of single- or two-parent families is critical, so that economic return can be maximized. In order to achieve that, they say, it is necessary to ensure that free child care and early education be made available to all families.
 - Which is more important for children: a stable and dignified home with loving parents, one of whom might be available to stay home part or full time, or maximized economic returns?
 - To the extent that being home with a parent is best for a child, how can that be encouraged by society?
- In a publicly-funded healthcare system, does there exist any obligation for an individual to take reasonable measures to avoid health issues (e.g., maintain healthy nutrition, wear a mask during a pandemic, or a helmet while riding a bicycle), so as to avoid becoming a burden to the healthcare system when preventable illness or injury occurs? If so, what can or should be done about it?
- Pope Francis has spoken of "ideological" or "cultural" colonization, in which the popular and dominant values
 of the powerful are imposed on local populations. When decisions are made by governments regarding the
 purpose of investments injected into arts and culture, who is being consulted? Who is being heard?

Solidarity

It is always important, as Archbishop Donald Bolen of Regina has said, "to listen to the voices of the suffering, to be guided by them in how we respond and to be ready to engage with them in moving forward." (Catholic Register 18 July 2021)

• Who, in Newfoundland and Labrador, and around the world, is suffering now? What should be done about it?

Indigenous Rights & Reconciliation

How can the provincial government and the Church work together to facilitate real reconciliation with Indigenous peoples, so that all Canadians can benefit from re-established right-relationships?

Refugees & Newcomers

What is being done to ensure that refugees and newcomers are safe, healthy, and enabled to flourish in Newfoundland and Labrador?

Northern & Rural Communities

What is being done to ensure healthy rural or remote life in Newfoundland and Labrador? Who should do it?

Rights & Responsibilities

It is clear that the nation and the provinces owe citizens great respect for each of a broad range of human rights. But with rights come responsibilities. What responsibilities do individuals have toward their communities, the nation, and the world?

- To what extent are citizens called to:
 - -participate in society, for example through informed voting, continued engagement with candidates and elected representatives, and keeping up responsibly with the news?
 - -lend a hand to their neighbours, for example by volunteering at home or within the community?
- Under what conditions, if any, is it morally right to require health care providers to participate in morally
 questionable practices such as abortion or assisted death, when it is contrary to their understanding of
 morality or their religious beliefs?

In addition to human and civil rights, many parties speak of things citizens and others "deserve."

How do the parties determine what citizens do or do not deserve? What criteria do they apply?

An Economy for All

Poverty Reduction

- Why would Christ say to us "the poor you will always have with you?" (Matthew 26:11) Is it possible that the poor will always be with us so that we, the living body of Christ on earth, will always have an opportunity to glorify God by examining the meaning and the causes of poverty, and working to eliminate them even if we may not succeed?
- How can Canada and Newfoundland and Labrador best strike a balance between the principles of solidarity – 'we're all in this together' – and subsidiarity – 'everyone should do what he or she can to support themselves, before burdening others?'
- What, if anything, should be done to ensure that a dignified living wage, capable of providing a dignified home and the ability to support a family, is available to all those willing to work? Should a basic income policy be considered?

GDP & Well-Being

For decades, governments have focused exclusively on gross domestic product – a measure of an economy's sheer productivity – as the best measure of national social health. More recently, voices have begun to advocate for a broader index of national well-being, to include factors such as the physical and emotional health of the people and the environment, equity in housing, income, and opportunity, and food security, in addition to raw production. To that end, the Government of Canada recently published a "Framework for Quality of Life" (https://www160.statcan.gc.ca/infosheet-infofiche-eng.htm), and instructed ministries to apply it in developing federal policies.

- To what extent is the Quality of Life framework consistent with the principles and values of Catholic social teaching?
- To what extent does, or should, a Quality of Life framework apply to provincial governance as well we federal?
- Is it reasonable to demand continuous economic growth, as business schools have taught for decades?

Good Government

The Role and Purpose of Government

Catholics have definite ideas about the purpose of life and, arising from that purpose, the proper roles of civil society, government, and other social institutions. Are those ideas shared by most Canadians? If not, how can or should we share our ideas with other Canadians?

Truth, Respect & Good Governance

It is an unfortunate and nearly universal practice for our political parties, in framing their platforms and policy statements, to focus at least as much on what's wrong with the other parties as they do on what's right about themselves. How can we, as citizens and voters, help encourage parties to look for common ground, speak positively and constructively about one another, and voice their suggestions for improvement in respectful and collaborative terms?

Fiscal Responsibility

Prior to the year 2000, most governments in Canada carried debt of less than 10% of gross domestic product (GDP). From 2000-2015, the ratio grew to approximately 30%. Since 2019, it has grown to 40-50% with a prediction that it will begin to diminish in 3-6 years. However, the predicted date of diminishment never seems to arrive – each year, it is pushed out another year further.

- Is it fair or even sustainable for governments to carry so much debt?
- Who gains from long-term government debt, and who loses?
- In the event of default, who gains? Who loses?
